**THE CHILD CENTER OF NY RECEIVES GRANT FROM EMPIRE BLUECROSS  
BLUESHIELD FOUNDATION**

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NEW YORK, NY – The Child Center of NY is pleased to announce that it has been awarded a generous grant of over \$30,000 from the Empire BlueCross BlueShield Foundation to support The Child Center’s Asian Outreach Program. The gift will help provide mental health screening, information, and counseling to 225 first- and second-generation Asian American students, ages 5-18, who live below the poverty line and attend public schools in Queens.

There is a huge need for the services this grant will help to foster. Asian Americans are the fastest-growing ethnic group in New York City, and newly immigrated Asian children

and adolescents face significant risks for mental health and substance abuse issues. Language barriers and strong cultural taboos against receiving mental health services

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have meant that many children do not get the help they urgently need. And a recent Mashable report indicates that Asian Americans face yet another challenge that often flies under the radar: a growing number of Asians -- approximately 2 million -- are living in poverty.

The Asian Outreach Program works to overcome these obstacles by partnering with school staff to identify abused and troubled children, providing therapy for these children in the neutral space of their schools, and providing information and counseling to families in their home languages.

Results have been strong: Over the last year, 191 children received on-site counseling at their schools through the Asian Outreach Program, and 87% of these achieved one or more of the goals they set together with their therapists. Program staff have also educated hundreds of parents, teachers, and community members about the signs of neglect, abuse, and mental illness. This has meant fewer incidents of abuse, and increased referrals to The Child Center's mental health clinics.

The grant from the Empire BlueCross BlueShield Foundation will enable The Child Center to reach more students and expand the Program's efforts.

"We are deeply grateful for the Empire BlueCross BlueShield Foundation's support of our Asian Outreach Program, and the faith in our work that it represents," said The Child Center of NY's Chief Executive Officer, Traci Donnelly. "Since its inception, Asian Outreach has played a crucial role in reaching severely troubled, abused, and neglected children who would otherwise slip through the cracks. This gift will strengthen our ability to give these kids the help they need and deserve, and get the word out about The Child Center's Asian clinics. We are very excited to receive this funding and to have a strong community partner in Empire."
